You cut and stack along the roadway/driveway and we haul away at no cost to you.

Please keep track of your hours worked on the volunteer hours form on the back of this flier. This is the in- kind match for the Firewise Community USA requirements. This includes watching the video.

Event Details:

When: Stacked piles need to be in place by Sunday Sept 22.
Where: The operator will begin haul away on Monday Sept 23.
Please do NOT add to piles after this date.

Pile Guidelines:

Cut and pile your woody debris along your roadway or driveway by the evening of Sunday September 22, 2024.

Piles must be stacked neatly with ends facing the road Please limit pile size to 5'x 5'x 5'.

No limit to the number of piles, please make sure they are not obstructing traffic or under power lines.

What's Acceptable?

Small trees, branches and limbs (balsam fir, spruce, brush) will be accepted. Woody limbs and branches up to 6" in diameter
No construction or building materials
